UIHJ position during containment

- There are many sanitary risks
- The UIHJ encourages the suspension or limitation of enforcement measures for the duration of the containment, unless there is a pressing need
 - A human and moral need in the face of a crisis of unprecedented proportions
 - A practical necessity, containment imposing health rules not compatible with the effective implementation of enforcement measures



UIHJ position after containment

Economic and social issues

- Bankruptcies, unemployment, over-indebtedness
- Non-enforcement will lead to serious cash flow problems for SMEs
- Today's creditors risk becoming tomorrow's debtors
- "Domino" effect in the event of a moratorium on enforcement why paying debts?
- Economic operators will lose confidence in the legal system
- There needs to be a balance between the rights of the creditor and the rights of the debtor
- We need to get out of this view of "virologist" only and we must take into account the economic, social and legal aspects to try to find the right balance.



UIHJ position after containment

Legal issues

- The right to enforcement within a reasonable time (Hornsby v. Greece) on the basis of Article 6-1 of the European Convention on Human Rights
- The judicial officer is an essential element of the rule of law (Pini et a. v Romania)
- Suspension of enforcement only for the time strictly necessary to find a satisfactory solution in the fight against COVID-19
- Risk of conviction of states by the European Court of Human Rights
- Avoid the use of any form of "private justice"
- Suspending the enforcement of court decisions = an attack on the rule of law



The solutions proposed by the UIHJ

- The need for enforcement of court decisions
- The state must ensure the legal security that is combined with the rule of law
- "Legal certainty is the right to the judge; the right to the judge is the right to a court decision; the right to a court decision is the right to enforcement; the right to enforcement is the right to the judicial officer. »
- The judicial officer is not only the professional for the enforcement of court decisions, but he's also mediator and conciliator



The solutions proposed by the UIHJ

Based on its experience, the UIHJ considers that any extension of the postponement of enforcement procedures of court decisions, after the end of a confinement period, would conflict with efforts being taken by the states to overcome the dramatic consequences, of the economic crisis linked to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The enforcement agent provides the state, the law and the economy with the benefits of a competent, accountable and efficient professional, capable of sustaining future economic prosperity.
